Camporee 2026 Information

Please read carefully and share this information with your club, staff and anyone else helping your club at the Camporee.

Date: Friday, April 10 through Sunday, April 12, 2026

Location: Camp Yavapines - 2999 Iron Springs Rd. Prescott, AZ 86305

Registration: Will be from 3:00-6:00 p.m. Friday, April 10, 2026 at the registration office.

Do not plan on arriving before 3:00 p.m. Please be sure to arrive with plenty of time to register your club and have your club campsite all set up before sundown at 6:30 p.m. We need to have an accurate count of individuals at each campsite so please plan ahead to make this possible.

Fee: Registration is required. Camporee fee is due on or before March 25, 2026.

Trash: Trash, garbage, etc, must be discarded properly in tied garbage bags and put in the dumpsters. Each club will need to provide plastic trash bags for this purpose. Be sure to leave your campsite cleaner than you found it.

No Pets: NO PETS are allowed

Food Sales: Saturday Night at the dome

Food Booth Information: Vegetarian Style

- You may sell any acceptable vegetarian food you like. This is a policy of our Youth Ministries Department.
- You need to register for a food booth. Please remember to bring all supplies that are necessary for operating your food booth (trash bags, tables, etc.)
- There will not be electricity provided for your booth, but you can bring a generator if needed.
- Remember you must make sure that your club cleans up the area around your food booth when finished.
- There will not be duplications allowed of menu items sold! Reservations will be given in a first come, first served basis.

Sign/Banner: Each club should have a sign or banner for identification at the entry of the campsite. The US Flag and Pathfinder Flag should be posted at the entrance.

Open Fires: Please, NO fires. At least one shovel, one bucket full of water and a fire extinguisher should be near the kitchen area at all times. Use propane or white gas stoves for cooking. You will want to bring a table for your kitchen.

Uniforms: Class A Club uniforms will be expected on Sabbath for morning worship and inspection. Newly established clubs may wear field uniforms. Clubs are to be in field uniforms at all times other than Sabbath morning.

Friday Sundown: Plan adequately that your club is settled and everything is in place before sundown at 6:30 p.m. Have worship with your club to begin the Sabbath hours.

Club Organization:

- 1) All Pathfinders should camp by units
- 2) Units must be made up either of all boys or all girls
- 3) There should be adequate supervision of Pathfinders at all times
- 4) Each club must be self-sustaining. That means each club must have its own food, cooking equipment, tents, tables, and other Camporee needs.
- 5) Always be prepared for rain. Use plastic ground cloths well tucked.

Responsibility: Each club is responsible for all its members and volunteers during the entire Camporee. All Pathfinders are to be in meetings or activities as a group with their counselors. No children or Pathfinders are to be roaming unsupervised.

Camporee points may be deducted for wandering children or Pathfinders.

Scrapbooks: Please bring your Club scrapbook to the Camporee and turn it in when you check-in on Friday. It will be graded and returned to you on Sunday during the awards ceremony.

Sabbath Activities:

- Sabbath School Bible Still Pictures: Clubs will be assigned a bible passage that should be presented in a frozen format. No preparation or resources needed.
- The Scavenger Hunt will include a quiz that teams need to solve in order to get the items to find. Detailed instructions will be given Sabbath afternoon.

Talent Tent: Show your Christian talent in a maximum of a 3-minute performance.

Pinecar Derby Race: Participating in this will fulfill the #6 requirement of the Pathfinder Pinecar Derby Honor only. It does NOT grant the honor badge. All the requirements will need to be completed in order to receive the honor badge.

Social Games: Come prepared to have some healthy fun Saturday night!

Quiet Time: A quiet atmosphere should be maintained until the next morning. Please indicate to your staff that talking must be held down as not to disturb those around that are trying to sleep. Tent walls are very thin. A staff member should be on duty until the camp is completely quiet.

Fancy Drilling: If your Club would like to exhibit your marching and drilling skills, make sure to sign up with Mike Wood before Sunday morning. Class A uniform required.

Departure Procedure:

- 1) Please make sure that your campsite is clean and that every evidence you having been there has been removed
- 2) Haul away all garbage in tied garbage bags to assigned dumpsters.
- 3) **If your club is in charge of cleaning restrooms please check the assigned restroom/shower house at noon, before leaving camp.**
- 4) Check out with your area coordinator. Make sure your campsite is clear and free of trash. Please send a picture of your campsite area to your coordinator before leaving the camp.
- 5) On the way out, please drive carefully and have a safe trip home.

Be sure that you have your medical **Consent to Treatment forms and **Trip Permission Slips**.



Soap Box Derby Race 2026 Requirements & Specifications



- 1. Creativity:** We will be looking for creativity in your soap box vehicle that represents your club, as well as speed.
- 2. Originality:** We want each club to be original in the design of the soap box car. You will be able to buy parts, however; we do not want you to just buy a soap box derby car.
- 3. Steering wheel:** The vehicle must have a functioning steering wheel in order to control the vehicle.
- 4. Dimensions:** Maximum Width of 3ft by 6ft of length
- 5. Brakes:** The vehicle must have functioning brakes for proper safety
- 6. Wheels:**
 - Any tire that is convenient, must meet the requirements
 - Keep in Mind Safety when selecting the wheels
 - Built for Speed

- ii. Provide Balance & Stability
- iii. Secure and Aligned
- iv. Tire Type Optional

7. **Weight:** Maximum weight is 300lb with driver

8. **Safety:** For Protection, the driver must wear:

- a. Closed helmet: must fully cover head and face.
 - i. Bicycle helmets will not be permitted
- b. Closed toe shoes
- c. Knee Pads and Elbow Pads
- d. Gloves: Driving gloves that have wrist guards and hand protection
- e. **Parental Consent:** The driver must have a parent or guardian sign for driving permission in the race.

Note: If any of the Protection requirements listed above are not met, the driver will not be able to participate in the race.

9. Please be respectful to everyone, we will not allow disrespectful behavior of any kind.

10. Cars must be registered and presented to the Soap Box Derby Staff by 8 p.m Saturday. Racing will take place on Sunday morning.

- a. Limit up to 2 cars per club

b. Required: A Video or a Presentation Board with photos of Pathfinders assembled, painting and decorating their cars is required.

Note: In the construction of the car that requires the use of dangerous tools must be operated by an adult for the safety of the Pathfinders.

Pinecar Derby Race Rules

Arizona Conference Pathfinders

1. Car Specifications (AY Honors Handbook: Pinewood Derby)
 - A. Must be made during the current calendar year or Pathfinder club year.
 - B. Width of car shall not exceed 2 3/4" or 70 mm
 - C. Length of car shall not exceed 7" or 178 mm
 - D. Weight of car shall not exceed 5 oz. (142 grams)
 - E. Width between wheels shall be 1 3/4" or 44 mm
 - F. Height from bottom of car to bottom of tires shall be 3/8" minimum or 10 mm
 - G. Use only axles, wheels, and wood provided in the kit you purchase.
 - H. Wheel bearings, washers, and bushings are prohibited.
 - I. Note: cart kits are available through hobby stores and online.
2. Once a car passes inspection and is entered into the race, only race committee members can touch it.
3. If the car loses a wheel, or is otherwise damaged, the racer shall have 5 minutes to make repairs.
4. Each car must pass inspection by the official inspection committee before it will be allowed to compete.
5. The Inspection Committee has the responsibility to disqualify those cars that do not meet these rules.
6. **Each Pathfinder Club will be able to enter one (1) car in the race.**
7. 1st, 2nd, 3rd places will be awarded to:
 - A. Fastest Car
 - B. Best paint, most creative

Still Pictures Activity Instructions

1. **Participation:** Each Pathfinder Club should include as many members as possible. **Bonus points** are awarded if the entire club participates.
2. **Bible Story Assignment:** The club will receive a **randomly assigned Bible story** during their inspection time.
3. **Planning Time:** Clubs have **15 minutes** to plan their presentation.
4. **Still Picture Creation:** Create one “still picture” using **motionless participants** and **minimal props** to illustrate the Bible story.
5. **Performance:** Participants must remain **completely still and silent for 30 seconds**.
6. **Audience Guess:** During or after the freeze, the audience will **guess the Bible story** being portrayed.
7. **Scoring:** Points are based on **participation, clarity of the scene, creativity, and accuracy** of the story depiction.





PATHFINDER DRILL DOWN

OBJECTIVE	To motivate Pathfinders to master the skills of close-order drill, and to give selected Pathfinders the opportunity to demonstrate their skills.
SKILLS REQUIRED	Ability to recognize and correctly respond to close-order drill commands given by drill master. ALL commands will be from the "PATHFINDER CLUB DRILL MANUAL" and/or standing commands pages 1 & 2 and moving commands page 1 of the "PATHFINDER CLUB DRILL DVD 'THE BASIC'"
PARTICIPANTS	There will be 2 categories: Pathfinders (grades 5th - 8th) and TLT's (grades 9th - 12th).
PROCEDURE	Participants will follow close-order drill commands issued by the Drill Master for a designated period of time. Each Pathfinder will continue participating in the drill-down until an error is made. The honor system will be observed; therefore, participants are expected to remove themselves upon making a mistake. In addition, each group will be evaluated by assigned judges. Judges will identify participants who commit an error, at which point the Pathfinder will be eliminated from the drill-down.
JUDGING	Area Coordinators, Pastors and special guests will serve as judges.
SCORING	Last 3 persons standing will be awarded first, second and third place winners.
